FIRST EVER FOR CHS

Early in 2008, a small group of interested CHS alumni began meeting with school officials to consider how best to (1) celebrate the school's upcoming 100th anniversary football game with Jordan High School and (2) organize and establish a permanent and ongoing CHS Alumni Association.

After recruiting a large committee of key representatives of alums from as many graduating classes as possible, the date for celebrating this first-ever football classic was set in coordination with school and city officials for September 5, 2008. Jordan High School was invited to join our planning. As the word began to spread with mailings and TV, radio and newspaper coverage, excitement grew among both young and old alums. Of special interest was the change of venue for the game back to Memorial Stadium after years of gridiron competition elsewhere. The Mayor (having attended one of the two schools) invited committee members to Columbus City Council at which time the centennial event was granted full sanction and a formal proclamation from the Mayor was read at the pregame ceremonies.



Festivities were planned for the centennial weekend which included a series of diverse events: tailgating get together at Memorial Stadium which included (continued)

(from Page 1) tents and trailers for classes to meet and greet before the game, pregame ceremonies with all ex-football players, cheerleaders and band members from both Columbus and Jordan on the field, the game ball flown in by the Benning Ft. Silver Wing paratroopers, the game itself and half time activities with all alumni from both schools entering onto the field behind banners of the decade years. (Score not to be mentioned. but rematch was requested.)




Festivities spread into the next day: lunch was catered by Country's Barbecue in the CHS cafeteria, tours of the school were available and a book signing was held by Buddy Sullivan, author of *Dress Her in Orange and Blue*, which chronicles CHS athletic history. A Saturday night dinner-dance at the River Mill culminated the fun-filled weekend activities.

In summary, the first ever alumni event included a broad array of enthusiastic alums from some seventy years, meeting friends of years past from distances of 1,000 miles or greater and attending events of their choice. While individuals might not have recognized everyone else on first contact. embarrassment was lessened by each displaying a special name tag shaped like a CHS football. Without exception, a fabulous time was had by all. Before leaving for home, the question was already being asked, "When are we having the next one?"
