
Columbus High Ranked Number One in Georgia

Second Year in a Row!

2014 was an excellent year full of achievements for Columbus High School. Again, for the second year in a row, Columbus High has been recognized as the number one public high school in the state of Georgia! All of the CHS community could not be more proud of the consistent academic achievement from present and past students.

In addition to securing first place in Georgia, CHS has received national recognition by being ranked the 38th public school in the country by The Daily Beast. Jumping from number 105 in 2013 to number 38 this year was not easy. Nothing short of the strong dedication and determination of the teachers, students, and parents of CHS allowed CHS to climb the national ranks. CHS principal Marvin Crumbs commented, "This ranking serves as a sign that Columbus High School and the Muscogee County School District are going in the right direction in regards to educating the children in this district and preparing them for life after high school. We raise the bar and elevate the expectations for our students, faculty and staff; and they are always up to the task."

No other schools from the area were featured in *The Daily Beast's* ranking. The next Georgia public school to place on the list is Lassister High School in Marietta, which was ranked 210 out of the 2,000 schools on the list.



The Daily Beast uses six different criteria for ranking schools throughout the country. Each criteria holds a specific amount of weight in the grading scale; graduation rate and college-acceptance rate are the two heaviest weighing criteria. Statistically, it is obvious how CHS was chosen as the best in Georgia and 38 out of 2,000 in the country.




