CHS principal, Dr. Marvin Crumbs, was among more than 100 principals from across the country selected to attend the Closing the Excellence Gap Summit in Washington, D.C. this February.

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation and the Coalition of Leaders for Advanced Student Success (CLASS), two groups dedicated to the education and empowerment of students in financial need, sponsored the summit.

In schools across the nation, educators struggle to increase graduation rates and college readiness rates among students with financial need. Columbus High emerges as a leader in this area. With nearly one-fourth of Columbus High's student population coming from families who qualify for free or reduced-price lunch, the school sees a graduation and college readiness rate of 100 percent among these students.

This success rate set Columbus High apart and highlighted the ways in which it is ahead of the curve.

"I can honestly say everything I achieved as a principal is due to dedicated teachers, hardworking students, supportive parents and a school district that realizes every child matters," Dr. Crumbs explained.

Morton Harris '52 Leaves Behind Legacy of Service to Columbus High

Carl Rhodes, Jr. '04 reflects on his friend and mentor, Morton Harris

Last August, Columbus High School said goodbye to one of its most tenacious and loyal supporters and alumni, Morton Alvin Harris '52. Mr. Harris (Morty or Mort to his friends) was a part of numerous clubs and participated in many activities while at Columbus High, including the Columbus High School track team that set state records in the 880 relay. Beyond high school, Mr. Harris attended Emory University where he graduated with the highest honors, and where he was on the varsity track team, was an officer of the interfraternity council, an officer of the Emory debate team, President of his social fraternity and editor of Emory's literary magazine, The Phoenix. Mr. Harris then attended Harvard Law School where he served as editor of the Harvard Yearbook.

After law school, Mr. Harris began his legal career and practiced law in Columbus for over fifty years. During his career, he was awarded and recognized for numerous accolades and spoke at many conferences, continuing legal education seminars and events across the country. Mr. Harris' awards and recognitions from his peers, clients and the leadership groups, of which he was a member, are too numerous to mention. It will suffice to say he was a busy, productive and successful legal professional and member of the community. However, Mr. Harris' best accomplishments were marrying the love of his life and high school sweetheart, Judye to whom he was married for 58 years, his four wonderful children Alvin, Wendy, Tracy and Beth, and his grandchildren.

In September 2011, I began to work for Hatcher, Stubbs, Land, Hollis & Rothschild, LLP, where it was an honor for me to work with Mr. Harris, and to learn the practice of

law from a great man and an accomplished professional. Very quickly, I understood Mr. Harris not only had a passion for his work but also for Columbus High. Many evenings at the office after we discussed various work and research projects, we talked about Columbus High School and the Alumni Association Mr. Harris and several other active alumni started. Mr. Harris encouraged me to get involved, and I later learned he encouraged everyone he was around to get involved! His generosity and willingness to donate time, resources and legal work to assist the Alumni Association matched his passion for Columbus High. I saw firsthand the hours upon hours Mr. Harris spent figuring out how to fund the Columbus High School Alumni Association's Endowment, targeting donors, and prospective members of the Alumni Association and developing projects.

Mr. Harris served as the Alumni Association's President and as its lawyer. Thanks to the tireless hours and work he put in, along with the efforts of others, Columbus High raised close to \$500,000 in a brief amount of time for the Endowment for Excellence to benefit the students of Columbus High School. Along the way, Mr. Harris convinced me to join the Alumni Associations' Board of Directors, and I am proud to play a role in providing support to Columbus High School through the Association. However, the effort of Morton Harris is the base for the success of the Endowment for Excellence Fund. We all should feel a renewed sense of urgency and commitment to seeing his dream of reaching a \$1,000,000 Endowment come true.

Finally, on a personal note, everyone who knew Morton Harris understood he was selfless, kind, willing to listen, sincere, intentional, personal and a gentleman. If you did not have the pleasure of knowing Mr. Harris, I can illustrate these points with a quick anecdote. My wonderful wife, Samantha, baked Mr. Harris some banana bread and I delivered it to him at the office one morning where he greeted me with his usual bright smile. He immediately tried the bread and, as he was eating, he opened his desk. On the spot, he delivered a crumb-filled thank you note for my wife. Although I explained a thank you note was not necessary, in between bites of banana bread, he said, "No, no, no, a thank you note is always necessary." That is something I will never forget.

Mr. Harris was my boss and mentor, but above all else, he was my friend. I will miss him dearly and think of him often. I hope those of us who knew him can be inspired to be more like him and those of you who did not know Mr. Harris will now understand a little bit of what made the man so great and a true gift to us all.

Morton A. Harris Leadership Scholarship Awarded

The first ever Morton A. Harris Leadership Scholarship was awarded on May 17 to **Caroline Kittrell '16**.
